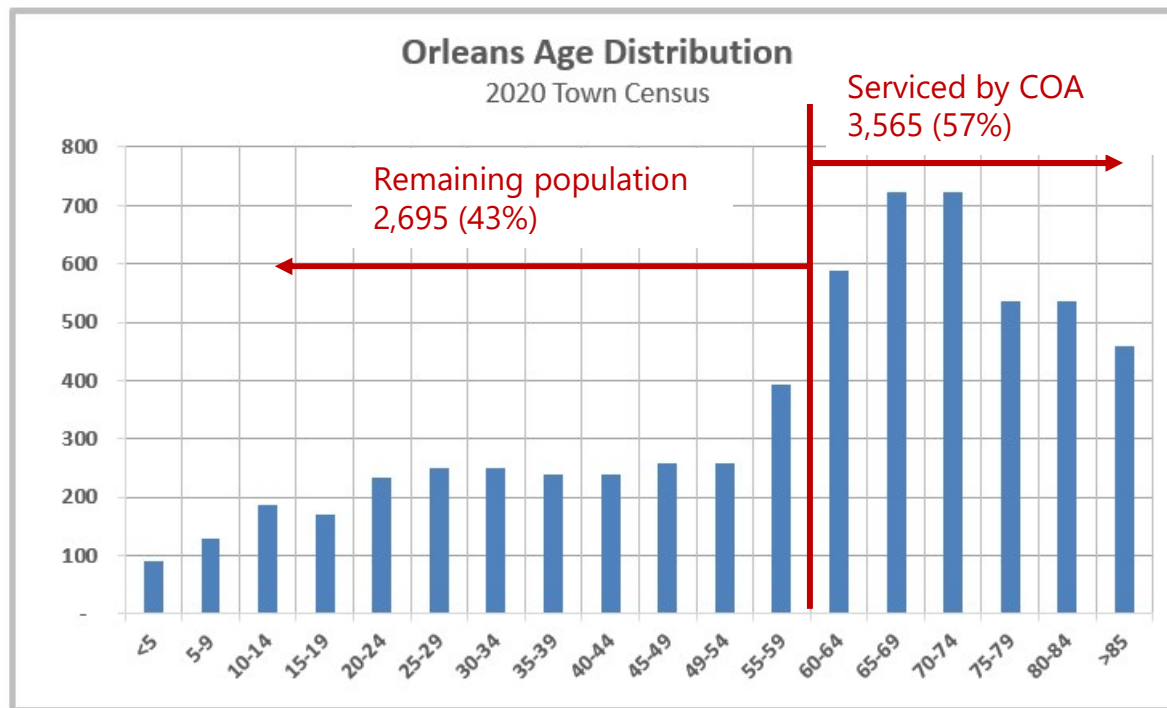


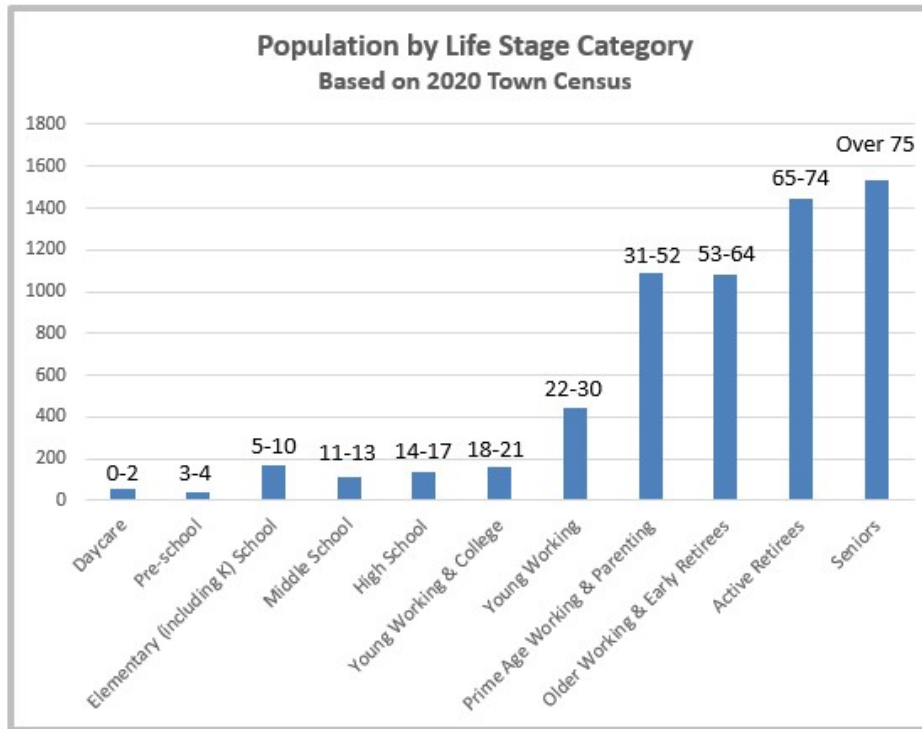
## Orleans Age Distribution – 2020 Town Census

- Young adults appear to be choosing to stay in Orleans but apparently don't have kids.
- Huge population of older (retirement age) folks who are still young enough to be active.

# Population by Life-stage Category - 2020

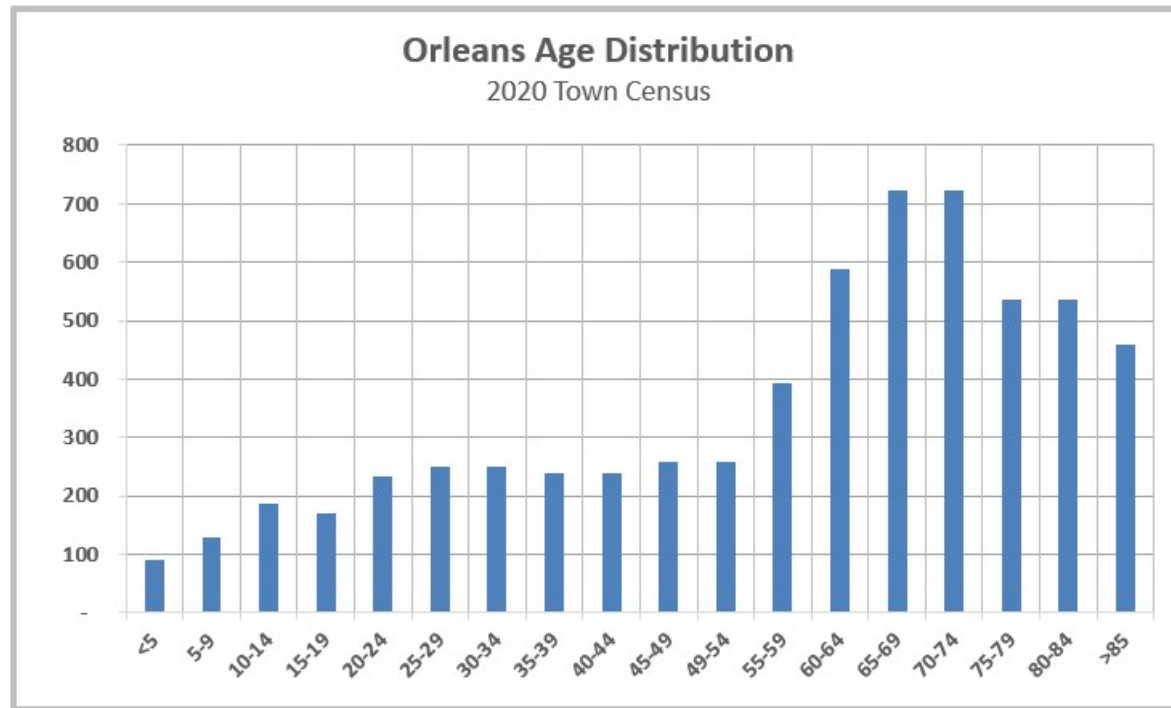


- Am simply introducing a new way to think about age distribution in the context of community needs.

\* Town census report classified ages in uneven ranges, some covering 5 yrs. and others 10 yrs. For better visualization, the 10 yr ranges were each broken into two 5 yr ranges. The values are the 10 yr populations divided by 2. They are identified with blue numbers.

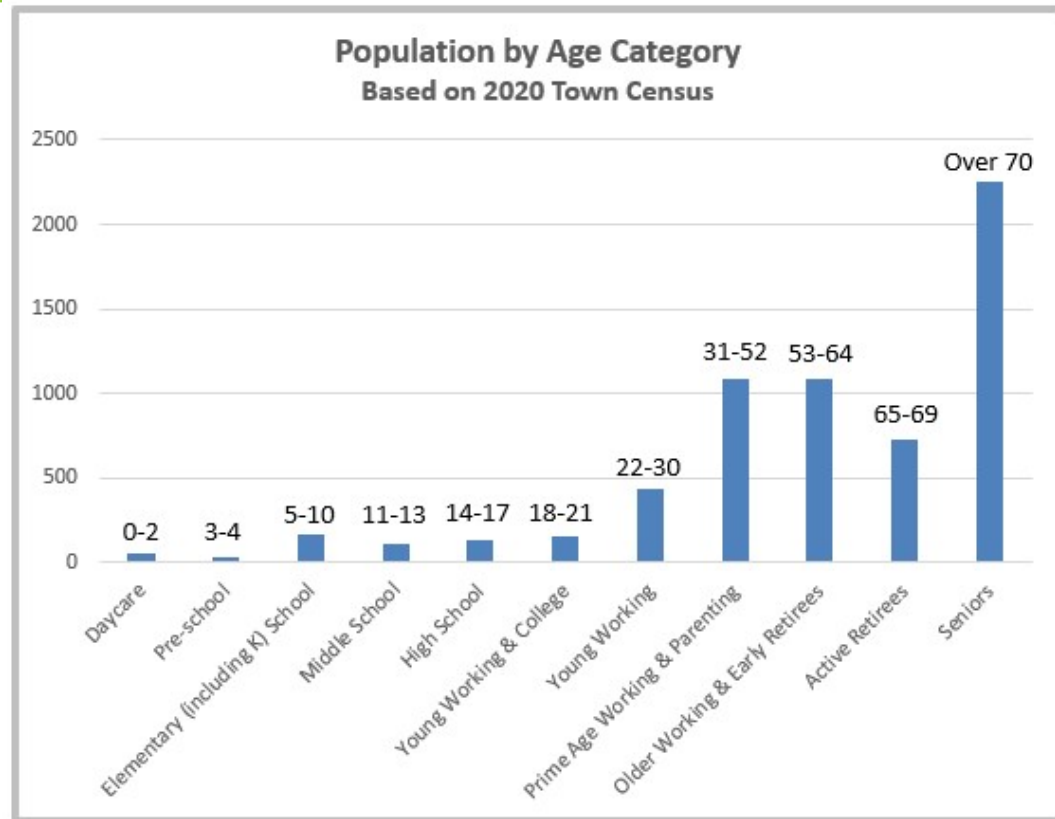

\* Number of people in each category is based the average number per year within the range and all the years are added up. Take Elementary school category, which spans ages 5-10, for instance.

-- Ages 5-9 (25.8 x 5 yrs) plus age 10 (37.4 x 1 yr) = 166 total in category.
